

## California Immunization Requirements for Preschool– 12<sup>th</sup> Grade

California schools are required to check immunization records before school entry. The following immunization requirements must be met before a student can enroll/attend school. These requirements must also be met when a student transfers to a new school, starts Preschool, Transitional Kindergarten, Kindergarten and/or 7<sup>th</sup> grade.

### WHAT YOU NEED:

At registration, you will need an immunization record showing that your child has received all of the required immunizations. The following are acceptable forms of proof:

1. The California Immunization Record
2. Another form of immunization record from your doctor with the date each immunization was given to your child

At minimum, the record must show the month and year of each immunization. You may need to call your doctor or clinic to obtain this documentation.

- Titers do not meet this requirement and therefore cannot be used as proof of immunization.

### REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS PER STATE LAW:

IMMUNIZATION	DOSE(S)	NOTES
Polio	4 doses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 3 doses OK if one was given on or after 4<sup>th</sup> birthday</li> <li>• 3 doses OK if student is &lt; 5 years of age</li> </ul>
DTaP	5 doses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tdap or Td if age 7 years or older</li> <li>• 4 doses OK if one was given on OR after 4<sup>th</sup> birthday or student is &lt; 5 years of age</li> <li>• 3 doses OK if the last one was given on or after 7<sup>th</sup> birthday.</li> <li>• At least one dose must be Tdap or DTaP/DTP given on or after the 7<sup>th</sup> birthday for all 7<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> graders</li> </ul>
Hepatitis B	3 doses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Not required for 7<sup>th</sup> grade entry</li> </ul>
MMR	2 doses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Both doses given on or after 1<sup>st</sup> birthday</li> <li>• 1 dose OK if student &lt; 5 years of age</li> </ul>
Varicella (Chickenpox)	2 doses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• History of disease is <b>NOT</b> sufficient to waive this immunization.</li> <li>• A Permanent Medical Exception for Immunization(s) is required (CAIR-ME)</li> <li>• 1 dose OK if student &lt; 5 years of age</li> </ul>
Tdap (For 7 <sup>th</sup> /8 <sup>th</sup> grade)	1 dose	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Or DTP/DTaP given on or after the 7<sup>th</sup> birthday</li> </ul>
Hib (For Childcare/Pre-K only)	1 doses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• One dose to be given on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday</li> <li>• Two doses OK if age &lt; 14 months</li> </ul>

Polio #2	8 weeks after 1 <sup>st</sup> dose	
Polio #3	12 months after 2 <sup>nd</sup> dose	
Polio #4 <sup>1</sup>	12 months after 3 <sup>rd</sup> dose	
DTaP #2	8 weeks after 1 <sup>st</sup> dose	
DTaP #3 <sup>2</sup>	8 weeks after 2 <sup>nd</sup> dose	
DTaP #4 <sup>3</sup>	12 months after 3 <sup>rd</sup> dose	
DTaP #5	12 months after 4 <sup>th</sup> dose	
Hep B #2	8 weeks after 1 <sup>st</sup> dose	
Hep B #3	12 months after 2 <sup>nd</sup> dose and at least 4 months after 1 <sup>st</sup> dose	
MMR #2	4 months after 1 <sup>st</sup> dose	
Varicella #2	4 months after 1 <sup>st</sup> dose	8 weeks after 1 <sup>st</sup> dose

Has your child received all the required immunizations? If not, please make an appointment with your doctor or the San Diego County Public Health Department's immunization clinic. Take your records with you to this appointment. If your child's immunizations are not up to date when school starts, your child, by law **will** be excluded from school.

#### Conditional Admission Schedule for Grades EAK/TK/K-12

Before admission a child must obtain the first dose of each required vaccine and any subsequent doses that are due because the period of time allowed before exclusion has elapsed.

#### Personal Belief Exemptions (PBE)

PBE's are **NO** longer accepted

#### Medical Exemptions

A medical exemption (temporary or permanent) issued through CAIR-ME, completed and printed by your child's physician (MD or DO licensed in California), if any of these immunizations were not given to your child because of medical reasons.

- Temporary medical exemptions shall not exceed twelve calendar months from the date of the licensed physician's written statement
