Independent Study Contracts (*ISC)

Students who must miss 3 - 14 days of school should be on an ISC to ensure they stay caught up on all assignments.

• Parents must contact the front office at least 5 school days in advance to ensure that the contract can be prepared ahead of time and teachers can put work together.

Students must meet certain academic and attendance criteria in order to qualify for an ISC. Every ISC request is reviewed by school administration to determine if academic and attendance criteria are met.

<u>Attendance</u>

One of the most important things your child can do to reach the goal of success is also one of the most basic: attend school every day on time! Daily attendance at school is important, any missed day is a missed opportunity to learn. By attending class regularly, your child is more likely to keep up with daily lessons and assignments and take quizzes and tests on time. Research has shown that your child's regular attendance may be the greatest factor influencing his/her academic success.

If you are absent, you must

- Clear your absence by parent phone call or note within 24 hours.
- Make up all missing work
- See your teachers for help

According to California Education Code, absences are excused for a handful of reasons only. Please refer to <u>Education Code 48205</u> for the list of reasons for an excused absence. All other reasons will result in an unexcused absence.

Attendance is monitored by the school and the State of California. Please refer to the <u>CVUSD School</u> <u>Year Calendar</u> for the 2024/2025 school year.

<u>Truancy</u>

Students who are absent more than 30 minutes from the school day without their parents' knowledge or consent are truant. If a student is truant for more than 3 days an automatically generated communication will go home to inform parents/guardians.

Tardies (per Trimester)

- 1st tardy warning
- 2nd tardy teacher conference with student

- 3rd tardy parent contact by teacher
- 4th tardy teacher issues consequence
- 5th tardy teacher refers to AP

According to California Education Code, the only excused tardies are for illness, medical emergency or appointment, or the funeral of an immediate family member.

TIMES TESTS: NEXT WEEK, on September 6th, and every four weeks after, all students will be taking a multiplication facts quiz (100 facts, 0's through 12's in 6 minutes). We have been working on this periodically in class, however you could also help your student at home to prepare for this quiz.

- 1) Make multiplication flash cards and quiz your student.
- 2) Print each of the four different Times Test forms from my <u>website</u> and practice, practice, practice!
- 3) Log onto Hoodamath.com and have your student practice the multiplication timed test online.
- Play Multiplication War with a deck of cards (remove the Kings, Queens = 12, Jacks = 11, and Aces = 1).

GRADES: It is important for you to know I will be using iGrade Plus instead of the district program, Q-Zangle because it allows me to email weekly progress reports directly to parents. I will only update grades in Q-Zangle at the end of each 6-week grading period. **Please do not check your student's weekly grade in Q-Zangle**.

I update grades every FRIDAY and post them in my gradebook program iGrade Plus to be emailed to you on Fridays. If you and your student check his/her math grade before Friday, there may be blank entries. This means I have yet to enter the grades for that assignment, so please check back on Friday. Assignments turned in on Friday will NOT be reflected on the emailed report until the following week.

If you do not receive an emailed grade report today, please email me a working email for you so I can update my records. Be sure to include your student's first and last name in the subject line of your email.

You and your student received an invitation to gain access to the iGrade Plus online grade program. Be sure to set up your parent portal account so you are able to check your student's math grade at any time.
